Maccabiah Games Bursary Process

Notes and Guidelines

- Upon being selected to represent Maccabi GB at the Maccabiah, participants will be informed about the availability of means-tested financial assistance, subject to eligibility criteria. Upon request, Maccabi GB will provide them with a bursary application form.
- Participants, or in the case of Junior athletes, their parents / guardians, must complete the form in its entirety, along with proof of income (such as P60, P45, 3 consecutive pay slips, self-assessment tax form, signed letter from accountants, or benefits summary letter).
- If the applicant has not previously attended a Maccabi GB International Event, they may need to provide a character reference from a qualified professional (e.g., lawyer, accountant, or teacher).
- Bursary requests should be directed to Maccabi GB's Director of Finance, who will then forward the applications to the Bursary Awards Committee.
- Members of the Maccabi GB Bursary Awards Committee will evaluate applications based on criteria such as financial hardship, personal fundraising efforts, attendance at previous events, and sporting merit.
- Participants will be notified of their bursary awards by Maccabi GB's Head of Finance through standard approved letters.
- If a participant is unable to cover any shortfall in the awarded amount, they may appeal to Maccabi GB for an increase in the bursary award. In such cases, the applicant will be required to submit a supplemental letter explaining any change in circumstances and reasons for the appeal.

The bursary process is overseen by Maccabi GB's Director of Finance who will work in conjunction with the Bursary Awards Committee.
